

START-UP COSTS ESTIMATES

This worksheet will help you think about all of the different things you have to pay for as you get your business up and running.

This worksheet follows along with the Start-Up Costs section in Chapter 3 of the VR Self-Employment Guide. This is where you will record all of the things you need to purchase so you can open and start running your business. There are some common expenses to think about when you estimate start-up costs.

Start-up costs can be separated into five broad categories:

1. PRODUCTION AND SERVICE

- Materials and Supplies (*page 2*)
- Inventory (*page 3*)
- Equipment (*page 4*)
- General Supplies (*page 5*)

2. PHYSICAL SPACE

- Furniture, Displays, Shelving (*page 6*)
- Remodeling (*page 7*)
- Rent or Mortgage Payments (*page 8*)
- Utilities (*page 8*)

Remember:

Depending on what type of business you are starting, you might not have costs to fill out in each section.

3. ADVERTISING

- Advertising and Marketing (*page 9*)
- Signs (*page 9*)

4. BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

- Business Licenses, Registrations, Permits (*page 10*)
- Legal and Accounting Fees (*page 10*)
- Insurance (*page 11*)

5. OTHER EXPENSES

- Any other expenses not included in the other categories (*page 12*)

After you are done filling out each section, you will need to add up all of your costs to figure out your Total Start-up Costs Estimate. Use the table on page 13 to add up the totals from each section.

Materials and Supplies

If you are making a product, or providing a service, list all materials and supplies you need to make or deliver your first two months of goods or services. Materials and supplies are things you use up when you make your product or provide your service.

Equipment

List each piece of equipment you need to purchase for your business. Equipment includes things you need to run your business that have a useful life of one year or longer. This can be bigger items, like a trailer, riding lawn mower, camera equipment, or computer.
